<b>Minutes of previous meeting:</b> the Committee accepted the minutes of the previous meeting on 24 <sup>th</sup> April 2024							
Annual Plan: The Committee agreed a draft annual delivery plan to go to full council – Appendix A							
<ul> <li>Community Buildings: The Committee received the following updates –</li> <li>Caldy Valley Neighbourhood Centre held it's AGM on 29<sup>th</sup> May, attended by around 40 people and was very successful.</li> <li>Cllr Otter has gathered quotes for window replacements in the large hall</li> <li>The centre continues to be busy with a wide range of activities on offer.</li> <li>Vicars Cross Community Centre is currently offering a range of activities connected with the 10yr anniversary of the council taking ownership of the building.</li> <li>Vicars Cross Community Centre will be closed for the week starting 5<sup>th</sup> August to allow electrical work to take place and on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> July for an Asbestos Management Survey.</li> </ul>							
<b>Traffic issues</b> : PCSO Carpenter is keen to support volunteers in the use of the two speed guns that the council owns – the Clerk will liaise with him and volunteers to confirm dates.							
<ul> <li>Community picnic on Whites Meadow green space on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> May was met with very positive feedback from residents and Councillors felt that it was important to hold a follow up event as soon as possible.</li> <li>The Committee agreed to hold follow up event at Whites Meadow on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> July from 2 – 4pm with the police bike marking if possible, coffee and face painting.</li> <li>There was an update on the Community Funday at Thackeray Drive – Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> July, all going well but Clerk needs to check on insurance for trailer/stage.</li> <li>A Shed Lane clean up is booked for Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> June from 1 – 3pm. All welcome.</li> <li>Awards Evening on Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> September at VXCC and there were suggestions for awards.</li> <li>Remembrance Sunday – 10<sup>th</sup> November. The Committee agreed to spend up to £200 on more lamp post poppies as well as £50 on the wreath to be laid at Huntington Parish Church. It was noted that St Pauls Church is up for sale and there might be Remembrance plaques inside to</li> </ul>							

	the fallen from Great Boughton. The Clerk will contact the new Vicars at St Luke's in Huntington who is responsible for the St Pauls building and request access.
9	Information Exchange: The Committee discussed the untidy and dangerous state of the grassy bank alongside Heath Lane and agreed that the Clerk will get a quote for cutting it back. CWaC are responsible for the maintenance of the slope and the steps but have so far failed to meet that responsibility and the Committee felt that it was important that the parish council stepped in if needed. A letter will be sent to residents stressing that this was a one off cut and did not set a precedent for the future maintenance of the area.  A resident who helped with the Cedar pathway clean up has requested a similar event in Richmond Crescent and Norley Drive. It was also requested that a cherry tree be planted to enhance the area – agreed on Saturday 17 <sup>th</sup> August from 10 – 12noon.
