- 1. Assistance with hedge issue private walk, maximum height of hedge potentially over legal enforcement order, this is a lifelong enforcement and needs to be maintained until the hedge dies or is replaced with alternative boundary.
- 2. Tractor /tanker crash, vicars cross road, shell petrol station.
- 16 residents affected, no serious injuries, although stress and emotional trauma will take sometime to recover from, all residents are currently in temporary housing, and are classed as homeless. The buildings are awaiting structural support to allow access to the properties. Road closure will be lifted once the support is in place.

Meanwhile 24 hour security is on site to stop unlawful access.

Thanks were noted to the parish councillor who managed to get the residents to the community centre in the initial hours after the incident.

- 3. Bus stop/listed tram stop. Recent refurb carried out by LMS Heritage. Speciality in heritage buildings and street furniture, at my last Chester update meeting. I requested assistance to find a group to request member budget to update the tram stop. CWaC engaged LNS and have covered the costs.
- 4. New bench installed by the sandstone planters outside cherry orchard pub, post office , thanks to Cllr MacGlashan For the groundwork, I assisted with funding.
- 5. Attended the community liaison group for the new Wyldewoods retirement village, nice tour of the interior and some discussion ref the feel and look, desirability and costs.
- 6. Recent surgery brought 3 different residents with neighbour panning issues,
- 1 length of time taking to complete, into the 4th summer, and damage to property loss of access,
- 2, suspected unauthorised garden building late night noise.
- 3. Damage to property and none stop trucks and mess left by builders, confrontation with developers.
